Timeline.ng conducted it as part of a half-term report.

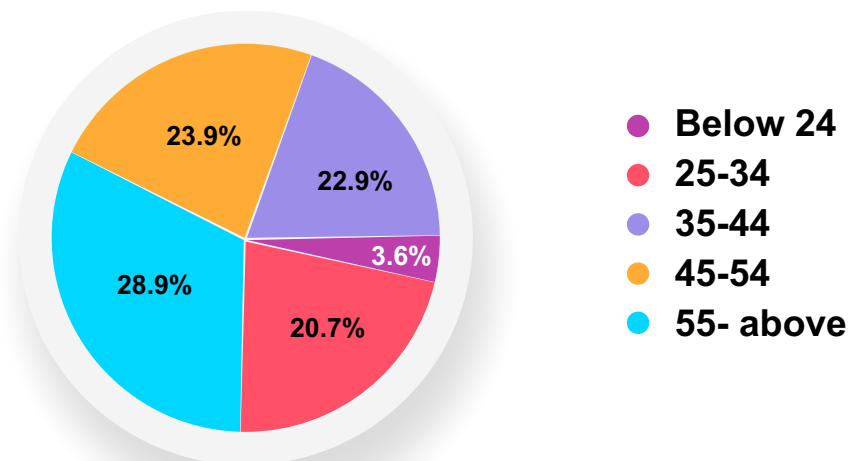
A total of 284 respondents from across the country participated in the survey which was administered over a two-week period.

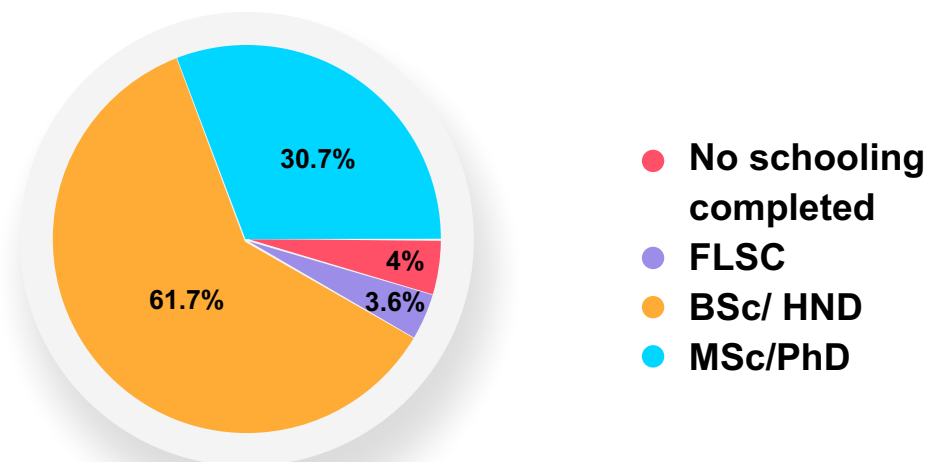

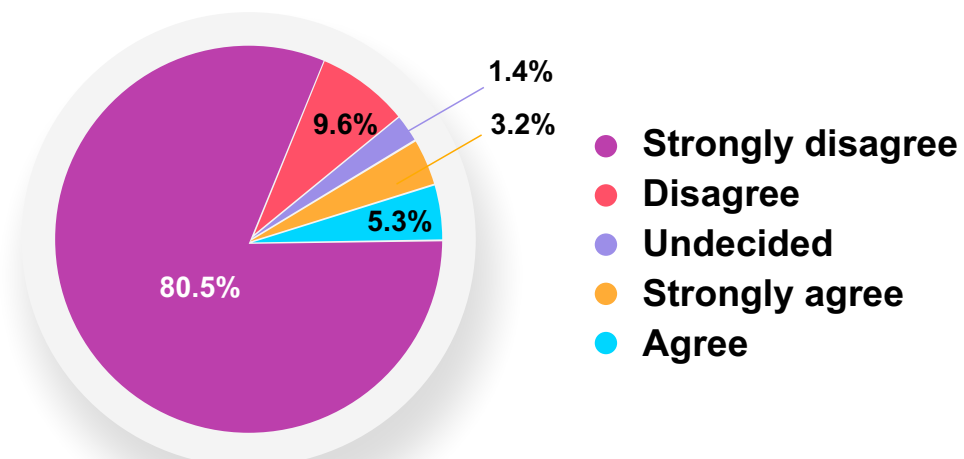

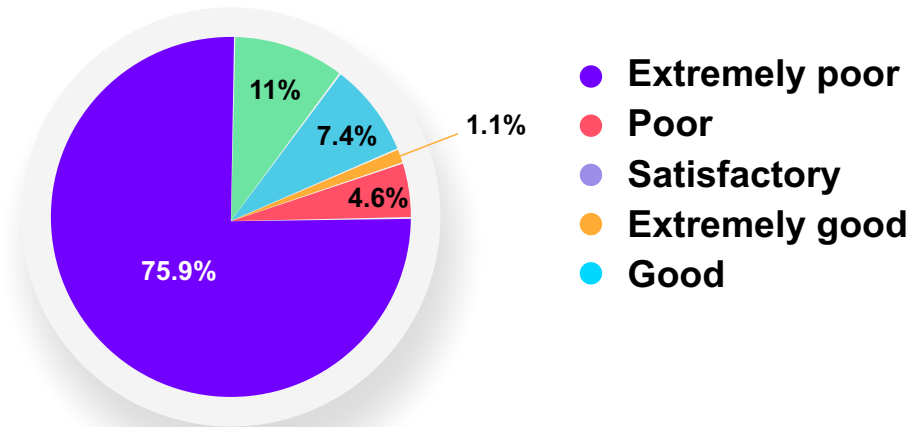
1) The government has improved security in the country.

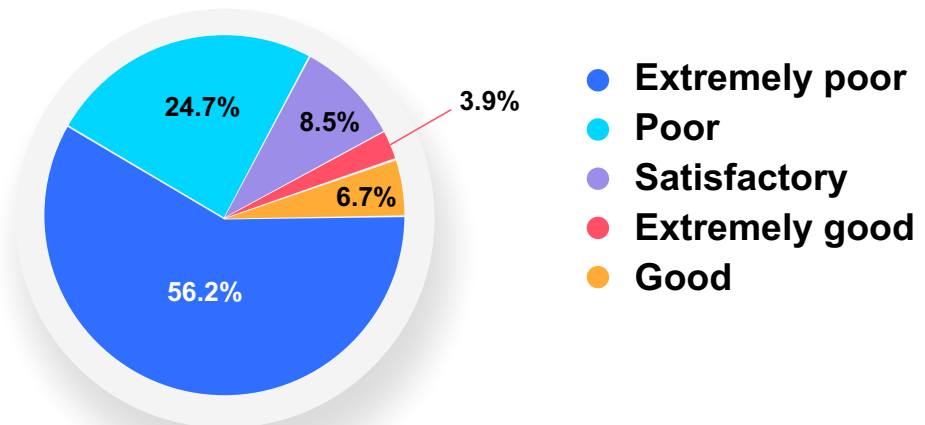
2) In mapping out policies, measures and laws to maintain the unity of the country, how well has the government done so far?

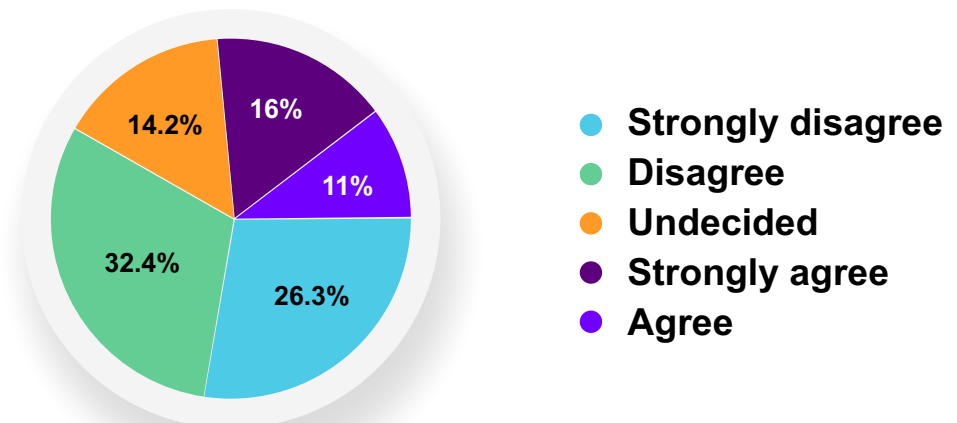
3) In terms of lifting a majority of Nigerians out of poverty, how well do you feel the government has done?

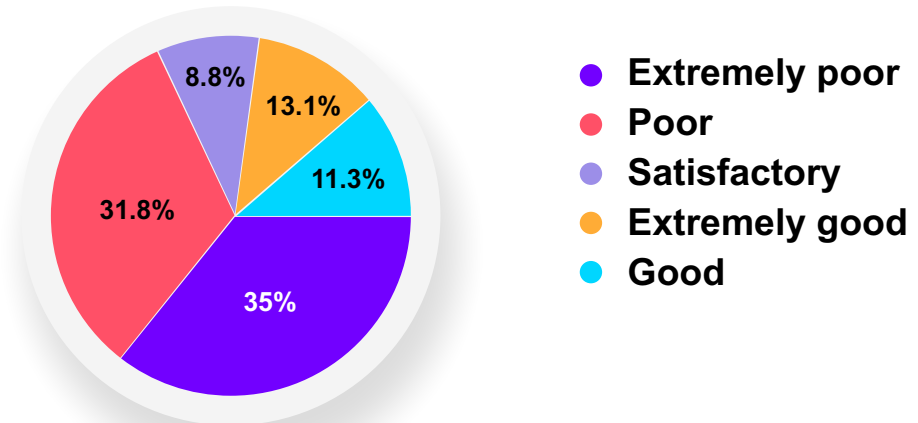
4) The government has extended access to small-scale credits and inputs to rural farmers, credit to rural micro-businesses and opened up many critical feeder roads.

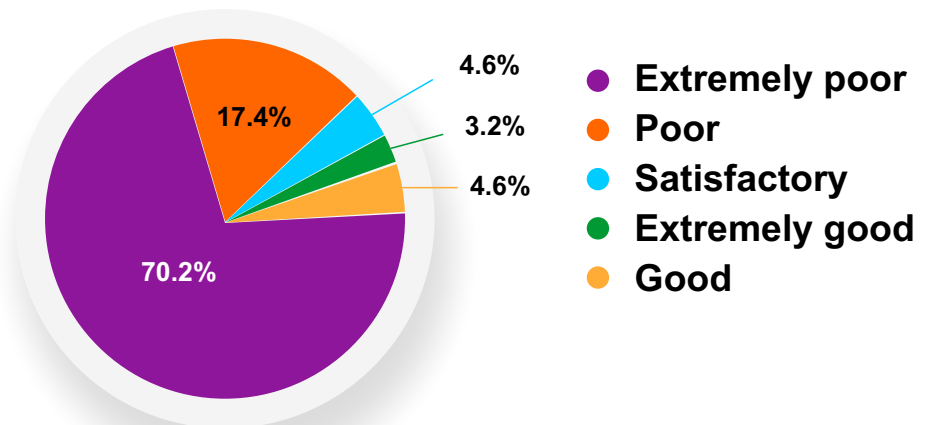
5) The government has expanded facilities for small-scale enterprises in towns and cities to encourage and support domestic production of basic goods.

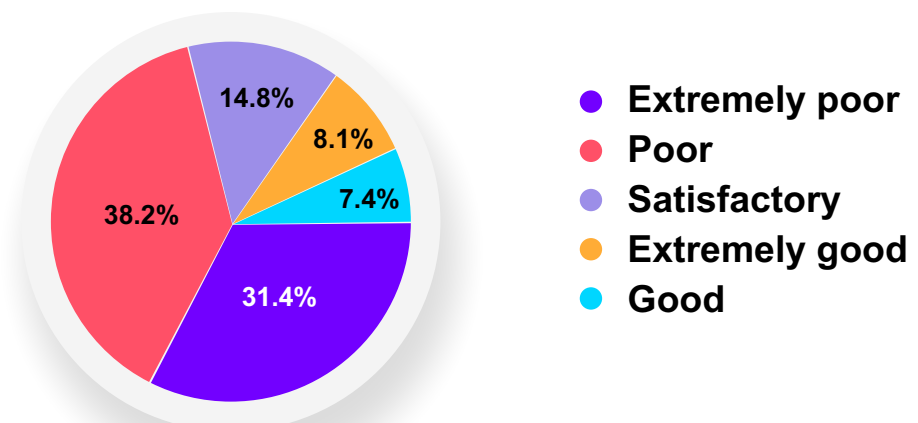
6) The government has resettled displaced communities and dealt decisively with the new flashes of insecurity across the country, food scarcity and regional stability.

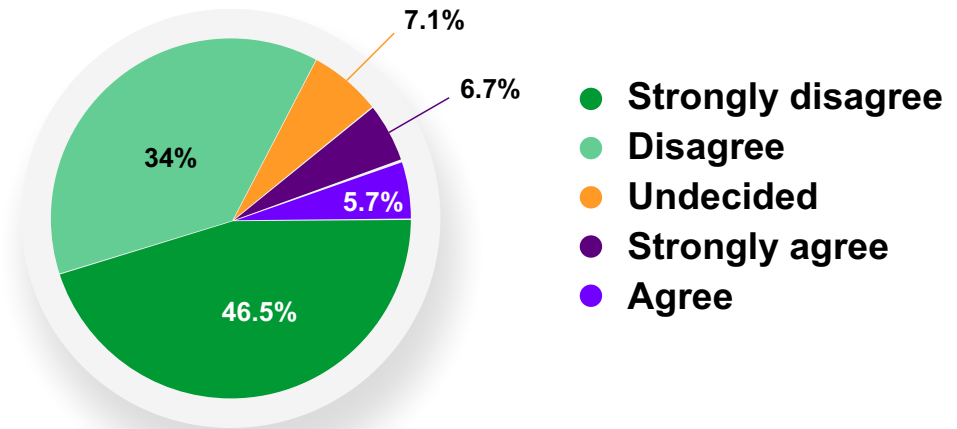
7) How well has the government done in the modernization the country's roads, bridges, electricity grid, ports and rail systems?

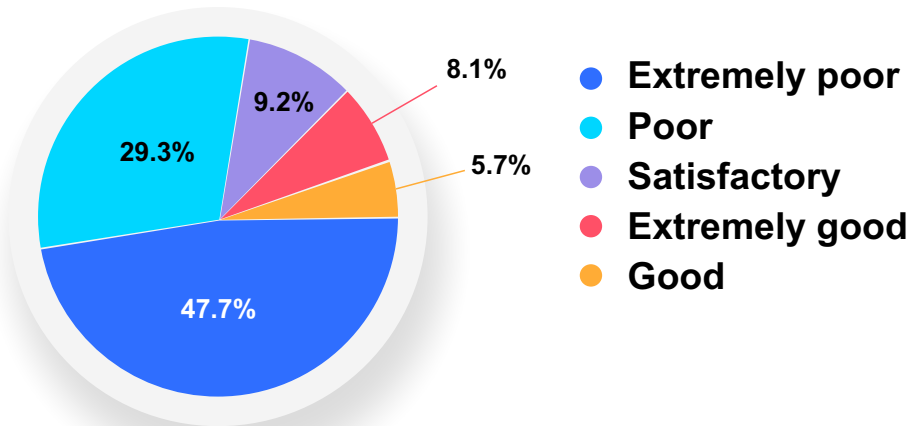
8) How well has the government worked with the private sector to improve productivity and accelerate economic growth?

9) In terms of reducing social and economic inequality through targeted social investment programs, education, technology and improved information, how well has the government done?

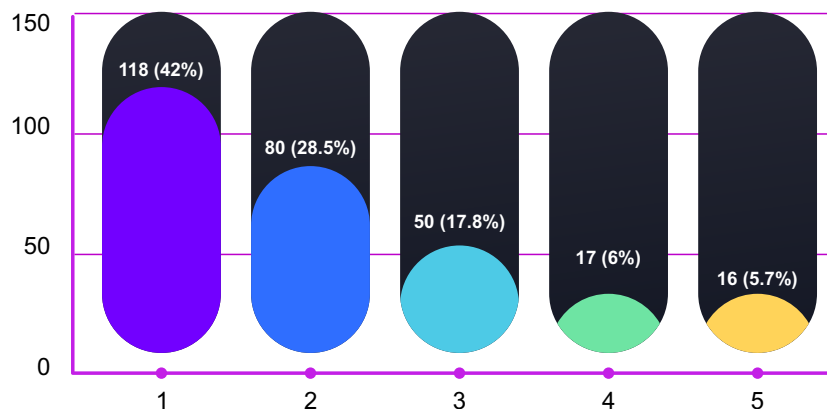

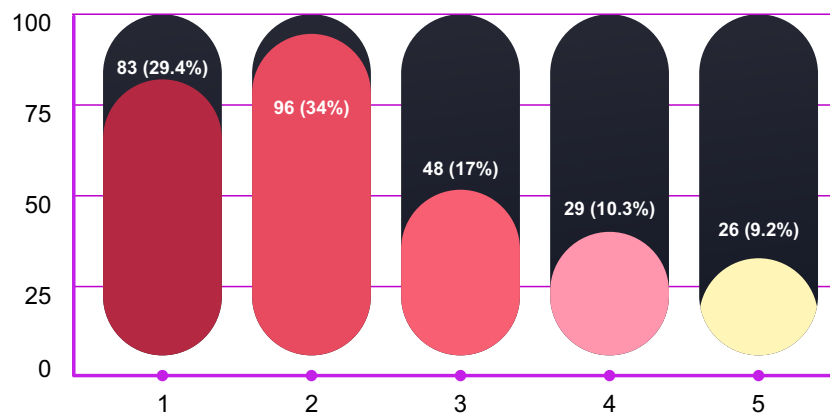
a). The government has consistently provided millions of school children with meals in primary schools

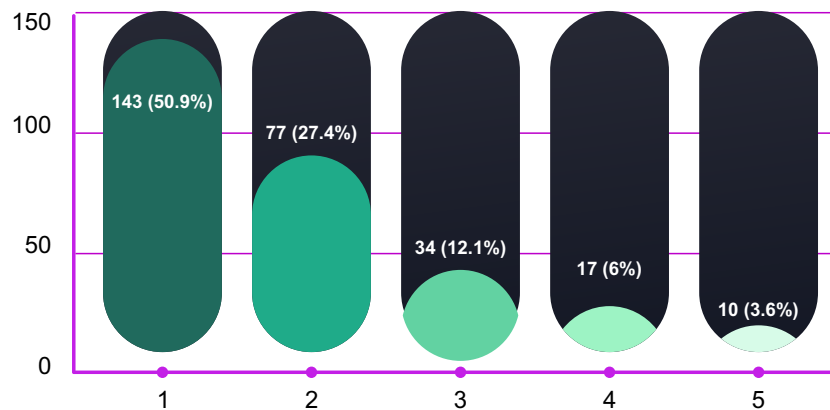
b). The government has consistently given micro loans to traders and entrepreneurs

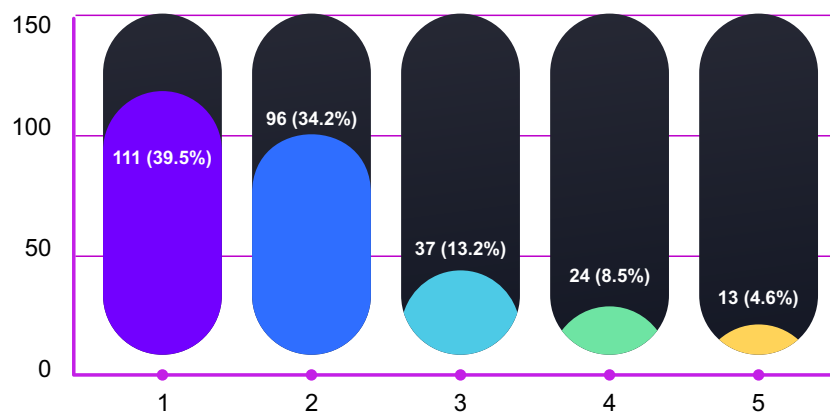
c). The government has consistently provided skills and knowledge acquisition support to graduates

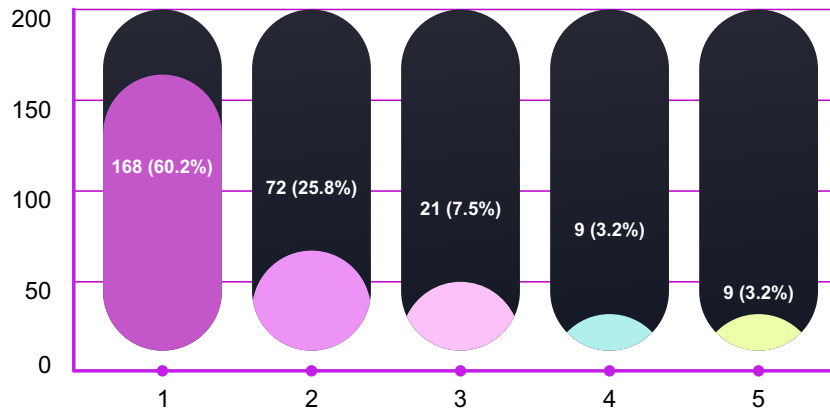
d). The government has consistently given conditional cash transfers to the poorest and most vulnerable in our society

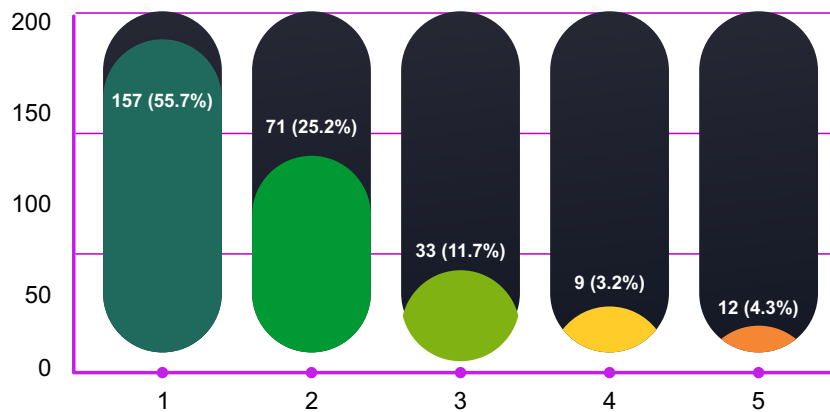
e). The government has done great investments in rural economies

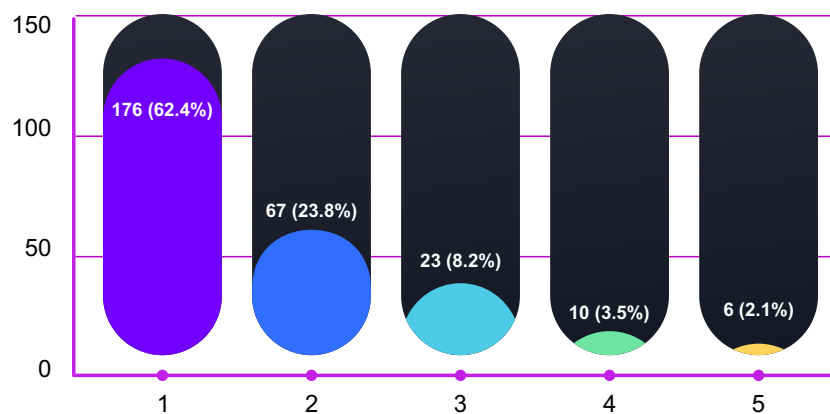
f). The government has aggressively sourced for local raw materials

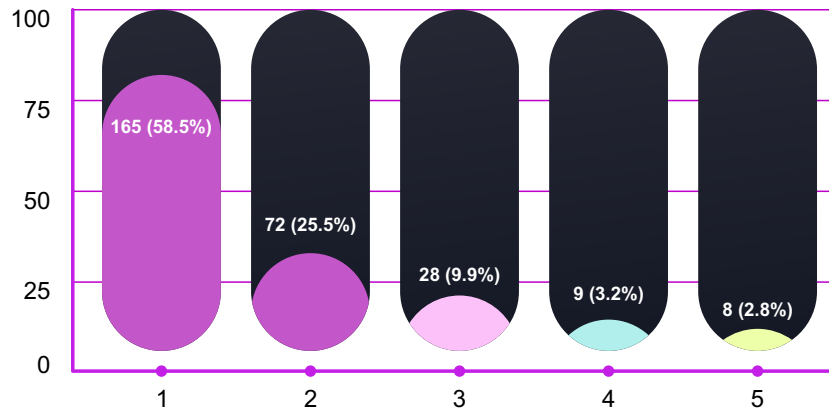
g). The government has significantly focused its resources in tertiary and technical education to reposition Nigeria's workforce for the modern technological age

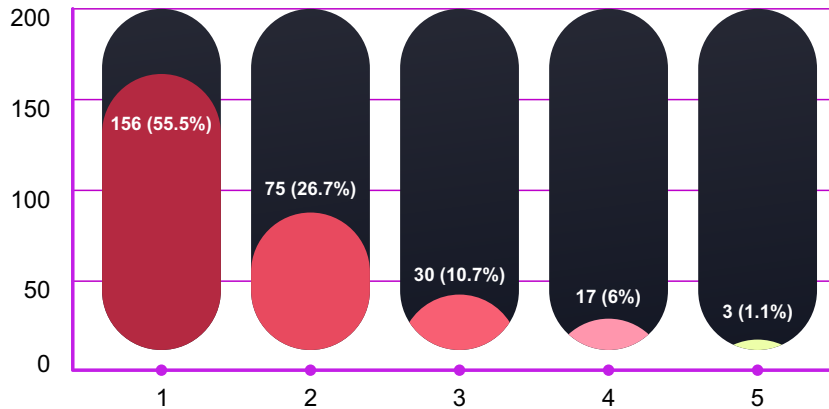
h). The government has significantly accelerated investments in primary, secondary and tertiary healthcare programs

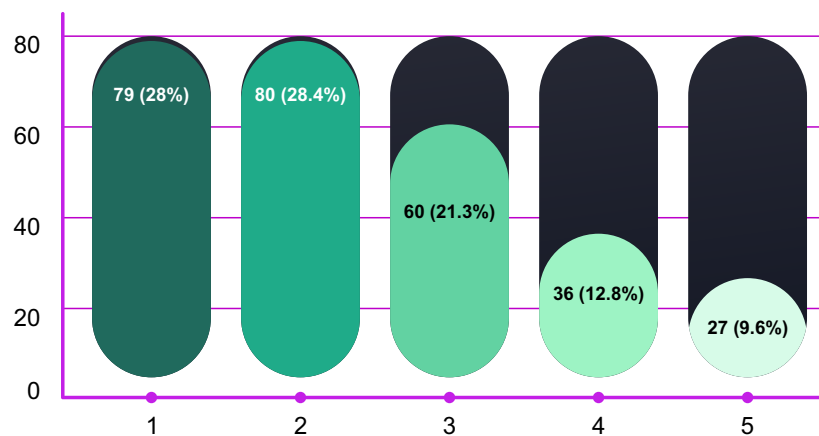
i). The government has taken steps to harness cleaner and more sustainable sources of electricity
